Executive Summary



Portfolio Performance

Portfolios ended the quarter with positive returns ranging from 2.5% to 7.0%. Equities strongly outperformed bonds meaning higher risk portfolios tended to outperform lower risk ones. Relative performance was positive across all portfolios, ranging from 0.7% to 2.4% over Q1 2024. The longer-term relative outperformance has been largely driven by a lower bond duration position last year in the portfolios with bond allocations.



Funds

Within equities, iShares Japan Equity Index and Fidelity Index US were the largest contributors, returning 11.4% and 11.2% respectively. Strong economic data in the US drove much of this, along with positive earnings releases in the technology sector. Legal & General Emerging Markets Government Bond (Local Currency) Index Fund was the only absolute detractor to portfolios over the quarter (-1.6%). Alternative credit produced positive returns although stickier US inflation towards the end of the quarter dampened this, with the Legal & General Emerging Markets Government Bond (US\$) Index Fund being the strongest performer out of the alternative credit funds (3.0%). Shorter dated bond funds outperformed longer dated, given longer-dated bonds were more sensitive to the revision of future interest rate cuts.



Responsible investment

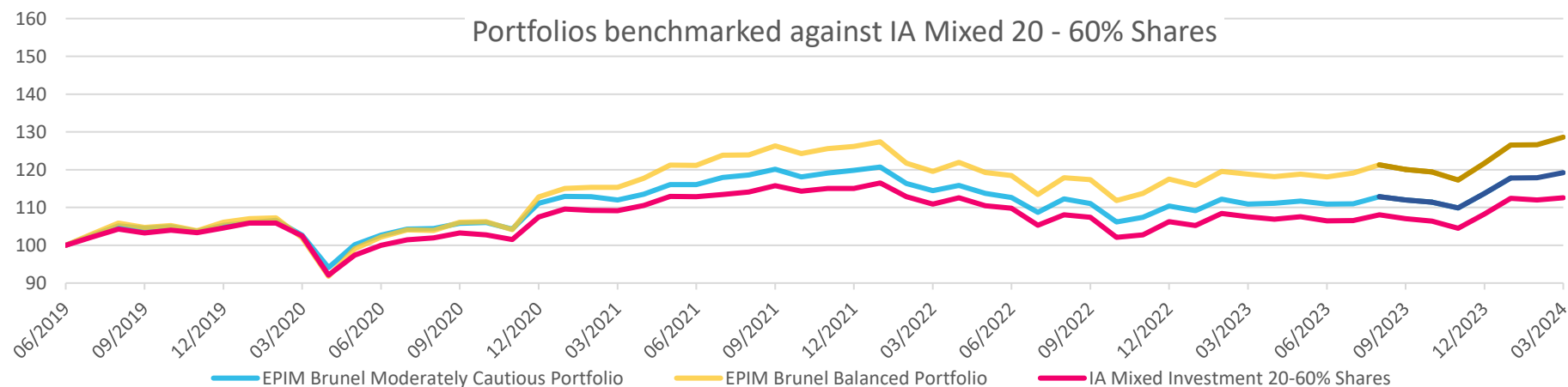
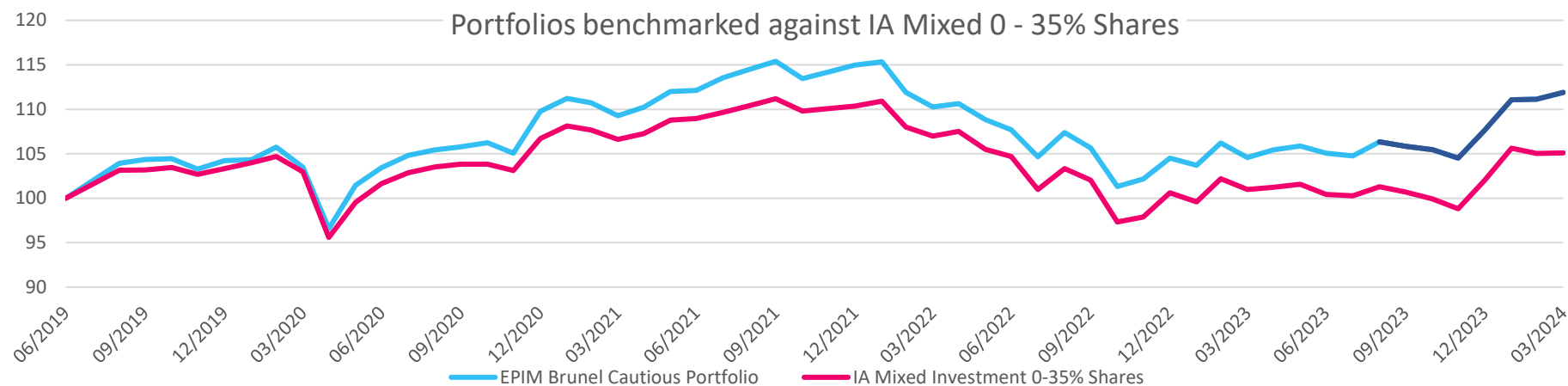
We seek to integrate responsible investment across our investment process. All the managers are UNPRI signatories and the portfolios include an allocation to a variety of funds with an ESG focus, including the L&G Future World Climate Change Factor fund, which has over 70% less carbon reserves intensity than its unadjusted benchmark, and the L&G Future World ESG Developed Index.



Changes to the portfolios and rebalance

HRIS began advising on the portfolios in July 2023, at the same time as the EPIM Brunel Equity Focused Portfolio was launched. We aim for portfolios to be rebalanced twice a year. We last instructed a rebalance in December 2023. We anticipate that the next rebalance will be in June 2024 as part of the strategic review and will notify you about any changes nearer the time.

Performance to 31 March 2024



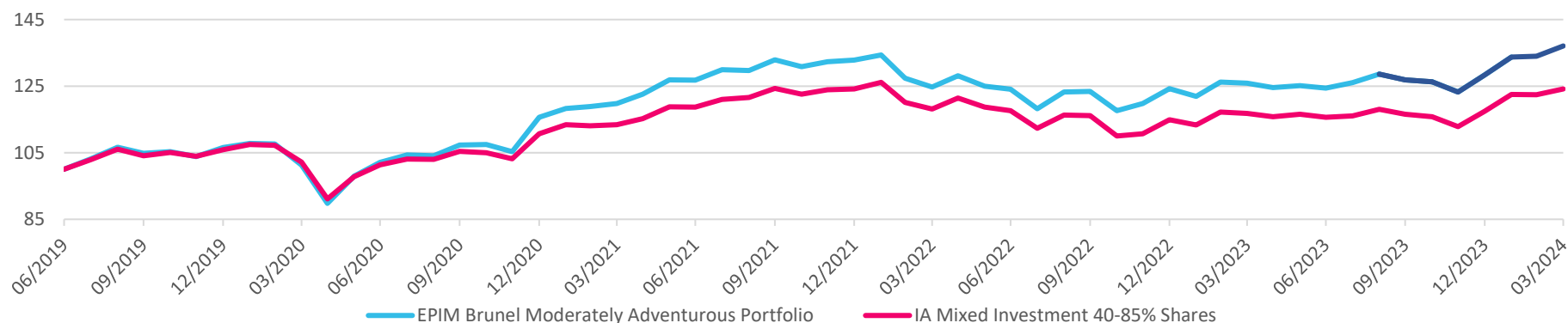

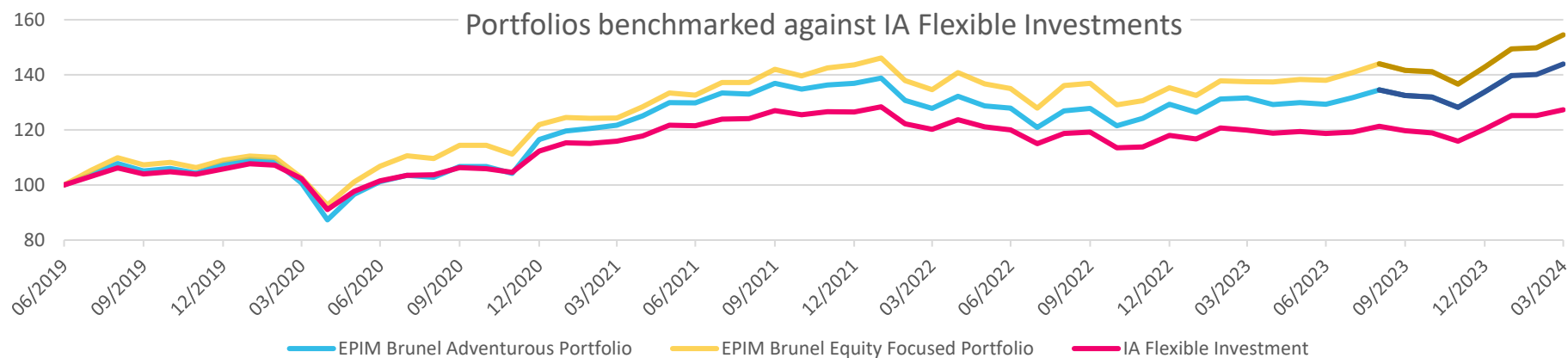

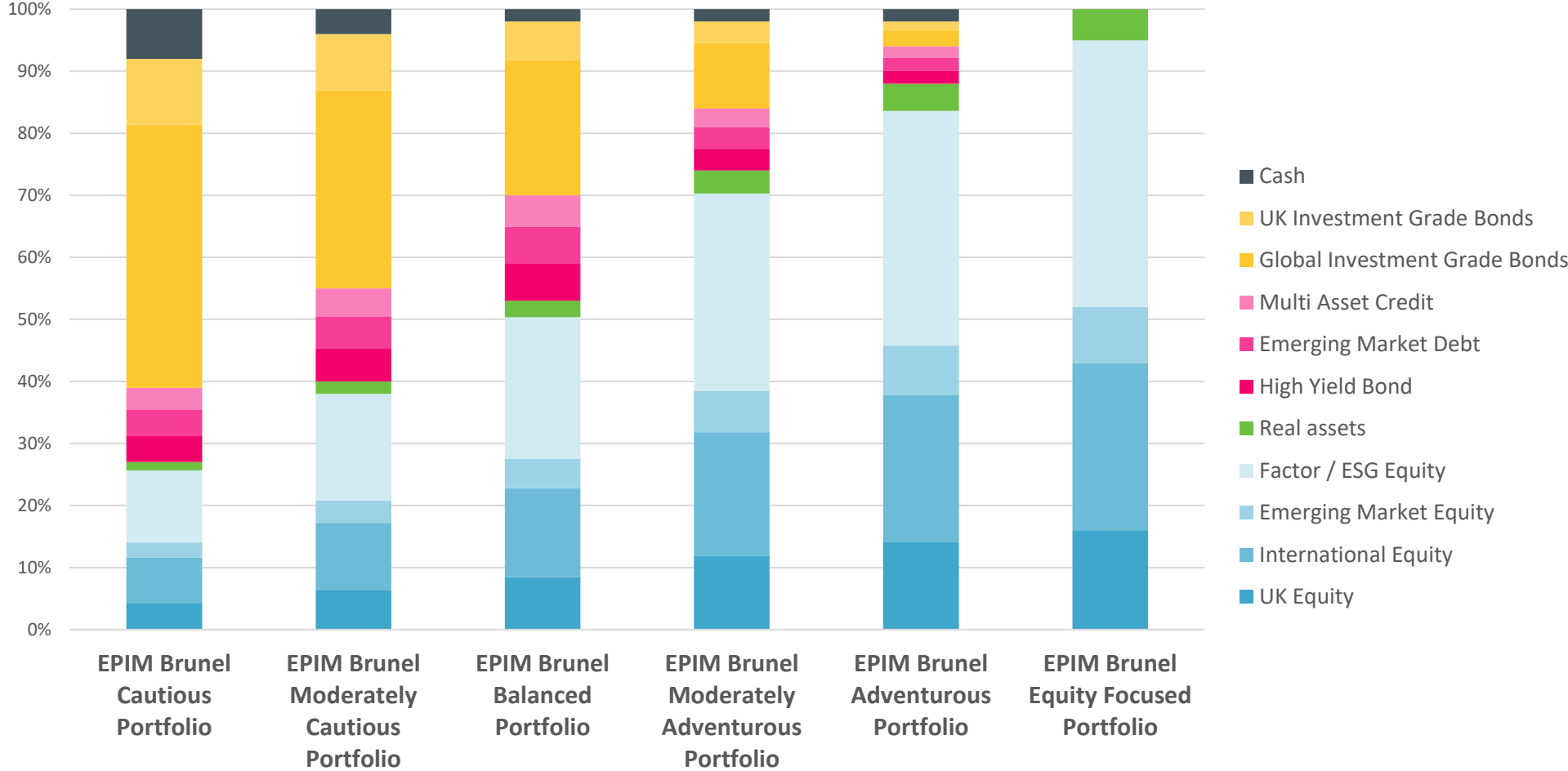

Economic Scenario Service used for Projections

The distributions of outcomes depend significantly on the Economic Scenario Service (ESS), our (proprietary) stochastic asset model. This type of model is known as an economic scenario generator and uses probability distributions to project a range of possible outcomes for the future behaviour of asset returns and economic variables. Some of the parameters of the model are dependent on the current state of financial markets and are updated each month (for example, the current level of equity market volatility) while other more subjective parameters do not change with different calibrations of the model.

Key subjective assumptions are the average excess equity return over the risk-free asset, the volatility of equity returns and the level and volatility of yields, credit spreads, inflation and expected (breakeven) inflation, which affect projected bond returns. The output of the model is also affected by other more subtle effects, such as the correlations between economic and financial variables.

While the model allows for the possibility of scenarios that would be extreme by historical standards, including very significant downturns in equity markets, large systemic and structural dislocations are not captured by the model. Such events are unknowable in effect, magnitude and nature, meaning that the most extreme possibilities are not necessarily captured within the distributions of results.

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
